Movement & Partitioning: Bioconcentration potential is low (BCF is less than 100 or log Pow less than 3).

Degradation & Persistence: Material is expected to biodegrade only very slowly (in the environment). Fails to pass OECD/EEC tests for ready biodegradability.

MCPA-2-Ethylhexyl:

The information presented here is for the active ingredient, MCPA-2-Ethylhexyl.

Fairly mobile, but rapidly degraded in aerobic soils. Rapidly degraded in aerobic soils (MCPA aerobic half-life = 24 days). The ester has been shown to quickly hydrolyze to the acid. Potential for bioaccumulation is low based on log Pow MCPA (-0.81 @ pH7).
